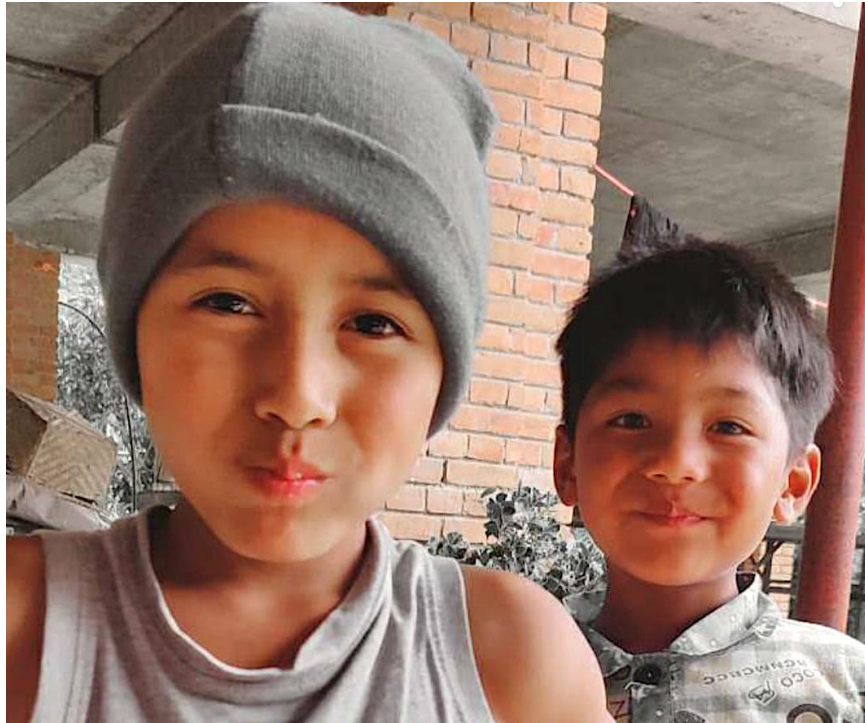

Namaste, Friend –

My letter from the 2019 Annual Report was full of optimism about the future and 2020 in particular. Little did I – or anyone – know what the year would bring. As usual, though, Bonnie and the Ama Ghar staff made the necessary adjustments with grace and brought our children through with flying colors.

For Ama Foundation, the first quarter of the year was frightening. Understandably, donations dropped as people all over the world adjusted to the “new normal” and an uncertain future. We put out an emergency plea to you, our Ama Ghar family, and as always, you responded with compassion and generosity.

We were forced to make our annual fundraiser virtual, which was all new to us, but that turned out to be a huge positive as we were able to reach out and see so many more of you all over the world. The event was a very happy family reunion via Zoom – several of those attended later told us they didn’t want it to be over because they enjoyed seeing the children and so many friends that they hadn’t seen in years! And thanks to you we were able to raise almost as much as we normally raise with the in-person event - it was a win-win.

Financially we didn’t spend our planned budget on school fees, as all schools were closed, but Bonnie reallocated some of those funds to help our alumni who had lost their jobs. We also paid a small amount to the older children who came home to Ama Ghar to teach and tutor; and our amazing staff, who were with us 24 hours a day during lockdown, received a well- deserved bonus.

2020 was my last year as Board Chair, but I will continue as a member of the Ama Foundation Board, and look forward with gratitude and pride to many more years of support for this remarkable organization. Thanks to all of you for making our work possible.

2020 started with everything in order and everyone focused. The children passed their final exams in March with optimism; then I called everyone to come home to Ama Ghar for a pandemic lockdown. I reacted out of fear, and a selfish desire to have everyone home so that we could meet this unknown challenge; I know from experience how formidable we are together.

Our first few weeks were full of fun and laughter. The older ones who came home helped to set up the Ama Ghar Lockdown School, rearranging our classroom areas and creating a new curriculum with lots of English and extra attention for those who needed help. Each took a teaching assignment and we had a functioning school. I can't say enough how effective and capable the older ones were with their younger brothers and sisters.

I am so proud of the children and even more in awe of our incredible staff. They stayed in lockdown without complaint and maintained their nurturing and caregiving 24 /7 without a break. I believe that the lockdown gave us many positives: more quality one on one time, new forms of bonding between brothers and sisters; lots of positive growth and appreciation for the world outside and blessings that we took for granted.

I can't imagine how so many people survived the lockdowns without the kind of wonderful social interaction that we enjoyed at Ama Ghar. We hope you and yours are well, too, and finding some positives during this very stressful time of new challenges. We thought of you often, and talked often about when we could have visitors again.

As always and especially for 2020/2021 we value you as our "heart family". Each of you must know that you are our lifeline and that Ama Ghar's resilience is in your capable hands. The next four pages are a family album of work and play – 2020 was a busy and active year, from pen pals to art projects to puzzles and games to harvest time... and school and medical exams, of course!

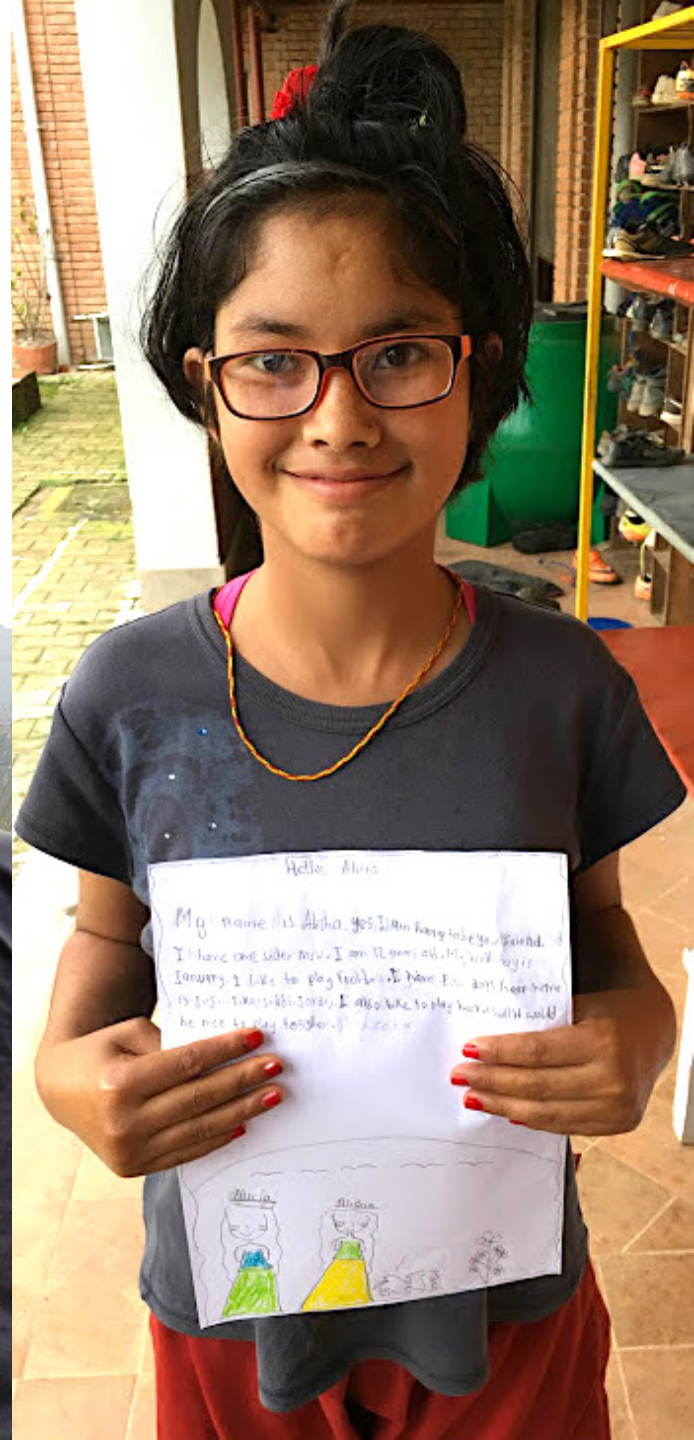

Our older children who came home to Ama Ghar during lockdown learned something new about themselves – they are great teachers! Their creativity, fun teaching methods and the one on one attention that they were able to give made school more fun and kept our kids up to speed when it was time to take their exams.

This year we had fewer medical needs, which saved us money over prior years, but we did have the quarterly checkups required by the government. Our counseling sessions were held via Zoom, which was actually more efficient than in-person and equally effective.

Sadly, we lost an important member of our Ama Ghar family this year – our beloved Dr. Neelam Adhikari, who has been the children's pediatrician since the beginning. We will miss her loving care and kind face, but we have been able to find a replacement who was trained by her, so we feel very lucky.



Activities, Outings and Holidays

At Ama Ghar, we celebrate Hindu, Buddhist, Muslim and Newari holidays as well as a winter holiday celebration that is all about peace on earth. Our children enjoy activities like chess, Tae Kwon Do, soccer, badminton and lessons in art, drama and dancing. We help them to develop their skills in anything that is of interest to them. Because of the pandemic we couldn't venture far afield, but we outdid ourselves with a huge production for Ama Ghar's 19th Anniversary. Everyone in the house participated, with singing, dancing, poetry reading and even gymnastic exhibitions.

Ama Foundation 2020 Contributions

Revenue Sources

In the U.S. in 2020, individuals, corporations, foundations and corporate matching programs made up AF's donor base. In total, they made 345 donations to the AF operating fund. Individuals made 88% of AF's total U.S. contributions. Foundations, corporations and their employer matching programs made up 12 % of total U.S. contributions.

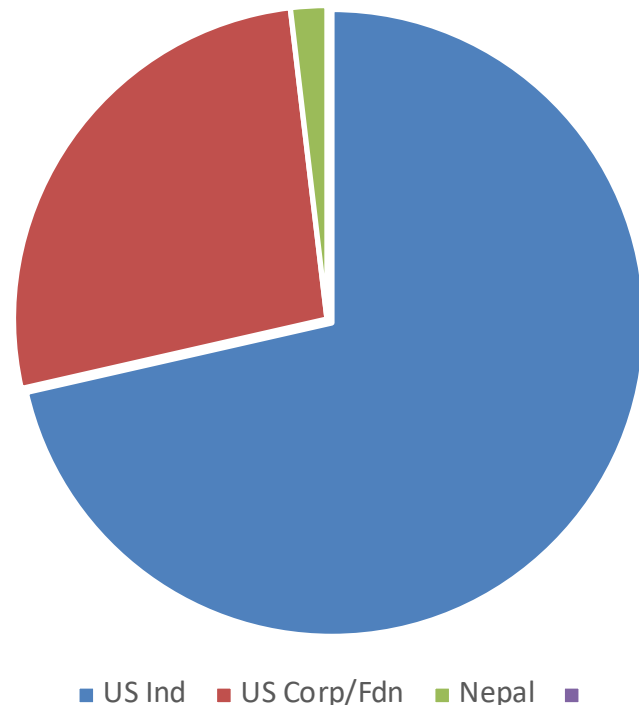
Average Individual U.S. Donation - \$490

Average Corp/Foundation U.S. Donation - \$1,287

The majority of U.S. donations came as single donations from individuals who gave between \$10 and \$15,000 to the operating fund. The majority of AF's operating revenue comes from donations in the \$50 to \$500 range.

International donations received in Nepal, accounted for separately, were \$3,880.

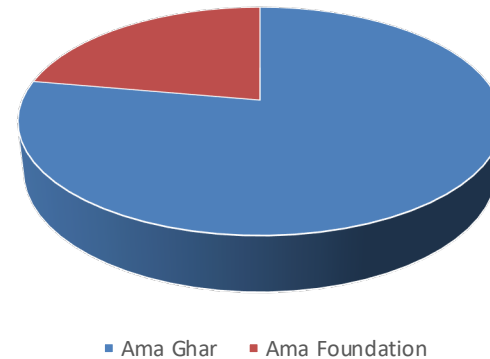
